## PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

The Student Discos are almost here! The theme is **When I grow up I want to be a ???** The cost is \$5 per student or \$10 per family. As per usual, there will be sausages, drinks, glow sticks, cup cakes and most of all, heaps of fun! The discos are held in the Old Hall.

Last week we had our school-wide Discipline Audit – a process where we are audited by external review to determine how we are tracking against the State-wide expectations for a disciplined school environment. Each State school in Queensland will be audited against this standard in 2014 and the results published on school websites. The Audit Report for Sherwood was very positive and identified many commendations for current excellent practices. When I receive the final version I will publish it on our website. There are recommendations for improvement which we will prioritise over the coming year. These include building greater consistency across Prep to Year 7 and using data more consistently and effectively to track the range of student behaviours including positive behaviours. We are already working hard to build these practices into our Behaviour Management Program.

On Monday I drove to Tallebudgera Beach School to visit our Year 6 on camp. They were having a terrific time and I am sure they will return with many, many favourite stories.

The Skill Streaming lesson for this week is Rewarding Yourself

1. Decide if you did a good job.
2. Say to yourself, "I did a good job."
3. Decide how else you will reward yourself.
4. Do it!

Building our sense of what we do well is important, I hope that you take some time to talk about this with your child/ren at home.

Last week I included some of our school NAPLAN results. It seems our efforts to improve Reading and Numeracy are paying off. Writing is an area where our results are less strong, and it's an area where we are currently developing plans for 2015 and beyond.

## MUSIC NEWS

### Classroom Music

Preps can sing Ickle Ockle for you and teach you how to play a clapping game. Year 1 have been working on memorising and notating the rhythm for a little song called 'Goodnight'. Year 2 had a go at reading and playing music on the xylophones this week and most people were very confident, correct and played with a steady beat. Year 3 are reading slightly more difficult music and can sing Sea Shell tunefully. Some are already singing in canon with Mrs Starr and doing a lovely job of developing their part-singing. Year 4 are revising their semiquaver rhythm and learning to notate a pentatonic song. Year 5 are working on singing All Things Shall Perish both in unison and as a canon. We have been focussing on producing a well-supported singing sound through various warm-ups and exercises. You may have noticed a lot of children practising lip trills at home. Year 6 and 7 are rehearsing their graduation song and have taken their singing very seriously. At the end of the year, there will be an impressive performance!

### Choir

Rehearsals are going well, although we have a few sleepy heads still finding the cold mornings daunting! Be aware that this is the time of year when wanting to quit looks like a great idea because the sunshine on the handball courts is calling! Let's push through this so that all choristers can enjoy the benefit of all their hard work as we head into performance season! Cantori has been working on a song called 'Happiness' and sound absolutely wonderful. La Bella Voci has a great collection of music but it looks like their favourite at the moment is 'Seize The Day' from the musical 'Newsies'. Hang in there, songbirds, before you know it the year will be at an end and you don't want to miss out on all those performance opportunities!

### Strings

The Junior Ensemble we have started to cater for all the young talent in the Strings Program is sounding amazing! Rehearsals on Thursday mornings have produced a very groovy bunch of players. In fact, they are sounding so good we are thinking it is time for the Junior Ensemble to have a performance uniform of their own. If they are going to sound good, it might be time to polish up our presentation and really blow the adjudicators away at the next competition! Sinfonia has a lovely selection of music to perform this year, including 'Let It Go' arranged by Ms Woollett herself! Let's keep up the practice as we head towards the holidays, the performance season is just around the corner!

### Band

Monsterband (our combined Junior and Senior ensemble) is working well with Ms Marshall. Make sure you are there on time at 7:30am to set up and ready to play at 7:45am, otherwise the rehearsals can't run smoothly. Keep working on your pieces and remember that if you have any problems, bring your instrument along to the music room at first breaks and Mrs Starr is happy to work with you. We have a dedicated bunch of players who regularly practise in the music room at lunch and Mrs Starr signs off on their practice sheets.

### Recruitment for 2015

Recruitment for the Instrumental Program is in its early stages already. Year 2 students who would like to be part of the Strings Program in 2015 have had a chat with Mrs Starr about instruments on offer, while Year 3 and 4 students may be eligible for places in the Band program in 2015. This will make being a member of the Band a little more competitive this year as twice as many students will be vying for the available places as our Year 6 and 7 students move on to high school. Our instrumental program is an extension of the classroom music program, so only students showing excellent skills in classroom music will be considered for positions in either the Band or the Strings Programs. Students who have already accepted places in the String Program in the past will not be considered for Band positions as this is both EQ and Sherwood State School policy. We hope you understand that we are standing firm on this issue for next year. More information about the Instrumental Programs at Sherwood will be forthcoming and a meeting with interested parents and students will be organised. We shall keep you posted!

### Ready Reader Volunteers

Sherwood State School is seeking additional **Ready Reader** volunteers to support the current Ready Reader program. The Ready Reader will be working with individual students to help them gain confidence with their reading and become independent readers. On occasion, you may be working with students who are competent readers to assist with improving their fluency and comprehension.

### Program Requirements

Volunteers can nominate the hours they are available for the program. However, Ready Readers are asked to commit to a regular weekly time that can be sustained over a period of time.

Volunteers are required to attend a one and a half hour training session to enable them to work effectively with early readers. The training will provide volunteers with supportive skills to develop essential strategies necessary for student reading success. Students will benefit from the consistent support to increase their language development, enhance their book selection and, encourage confidence and motivation to broaden their knowledge through reading.

All volunteers will need a blue card. The Working with Children check is a detailed national criminal history check, and allows people to be issued with the blue card. This card is required by any person proposing to work in a voluntary capacity, in a child-related area. The process for applying for a blue card will be undertaken during the training at no cost.

On Sunday 17 August our language students went to Griffith University on the Gold Coast to participate in the Modern Languages Teachers' Association of Queensland (MLTAQ) Gold Coast Branch and Griffith University 2014 Languages Speech Contest.

After preparing a short speech in the two weeks leading up to the contest, students were invited to make their presentations to a panel of judges who proceeded to ask the students a variety of questions relevant to the topic about which they had spoken.

Indooroopilly State High School placed within the top three in each of the competition categories we entered: Years 8, 9, 10, 11 and 12 Spanish and Year 11 Chinese, winning 5 First Places, 3 Second Places and 1 Third Place.

Many other students who participated in the competition also received high commendations in acknowledgement of their speaking skills in the second language they're studying.

During the Awards Ceremony, two of our students Addie Martinez and Hamish Blake performed two songs in Spanish (Bajo Otra Luz - Nelly Furtado, Viajar Contigo - Alex Ubago) which received an outstanding ovation by a very educated audience. 
