Last month I was selected to represent Australia in the 7th annual Chinese Bridge Competition for Foreign Secondary School Students in Kunming, China, a competition televised on Chinese national TV.

I was competing against 76 other countries with 134 contestants. The first three rounds of the competition included a test, a speech, and a cultural performance. I was in a team with another contestant from Darwin. Based on the results of the first three rounds, the top two teams of each continent moved on to the next round, and our team was lucky enough to be one of them. The next two rounds were broadcast live on TV!

In the semi-finals one representative per continent was chosen for the finals and, with our determination, we were chosen to represent Oceania! We battled hard in the grand finals, and got 3rd place in the entire world! I was given the award of Continent Champion as well as 2nd Place individual prize for my results in the first three

competitions, and now have a two-year all expenses paid scholarship to any Chinese University!

I had to sit through make up sessions, TV interviews, and constant photographs. This was definitely the most amazing experience I've ever had! Thanks to Ms Pan who came with me and was a wonderful support.
