Do you personally take responsibility for Road Safety and your part in helping to keep our school safe? Each one of us must do the right thing to help ensure our children are safe. **Follow the road rules!** Do not park across our neighbours' driveways, do not park in the 2 minute drop-off and pick-up zones and leave your car, do not double park. We have almost 600 students to keep safe – you have a part to play. We all have a part to play.

We need to keep our priorities narrow and focussed to make a difference. Our most important teaching and learning priority this year is reading. Our goal is to ensure our children are the very best readers they can be. We are hard at work to ensure our teachers are the very best teachers of reading they can be. Great teaching makes the greatest difference!

Strategies we are committed to across each classroom to improve reading are as follows:

1. Using data to make our teaching decisions. In every classroom teachers are using diagnostic tests for reading to identify what students can and can't do and plan lessons accordingly. PM Benchmarks are used in Prep to Year 2, and PROBE Comprehension in Years 3 to 6. The individual student diagnostic data is entered on OneSchool and this gives the school a larger picture of trends across classrooms and over time.
2. Ambitious but achievable targets are in place for each year level. Targets provide the impetus for continuous improvement and also highlight where we may need to devote more energy if targets are not being achieved.
3. All students across the school have personal reading goals and these are monitored by our classroom teachers to ensure students are making progress to achieve them.
4. Comprehension (understanding what we read) is the focus of our reading program. We specifically teach students strategies like QAR and the 12 micro-skills of comprehension so that students build a repertoire of skills to help them better understand what they read.
5. Guided reading and other evidence based strategies are imbedded in our staff professional learning plans helping teachers to adopt the most effective teaching strategies in all classrooms. Learning these strategies is supported with classroom coaching, mentoring, constructive feedback and other high quality professional learning strategies.
6. Early interventions are in place and we continue to build this aspect to identify where students are having problems with learning – early in their years at Sherwood, early in each year they are at school here, early in the cycle of learning a new reading skill.
7. Differentiation is the key to making adjustments to meet the needs of students ranging from the high achievers through to those who are experiencing learning difficulties.

Reading is our core priority and we are keen to ensure our Sherwood students become sophisticated and highly competent readers ready for the challenges of Junior High School. Great teaching makes the greatest difference.

This week I am on camp with the Year 5 students at Midginbil Hill in northern NSW. Camps are great opportunities for students to develop many important social skills as well as have a lot of fun building and strengthening friendships and building life long memories. Cross your fingers that it isn't raining!

Skill Streaming this week is about Recognising Another's Feelings

1. Watch the person.
2. Name what you think the person is feeling.
3. Decide whether or not to ask the person if he/she is feeling that way.
4. Ask in a concerned voice.

Take time to discuss this at home and support our important lessons at school.

Am I too late to get a team? Never – team on and let me know. If you don't have a full table, tell me as I have some people waiting to join you in the night's activities.

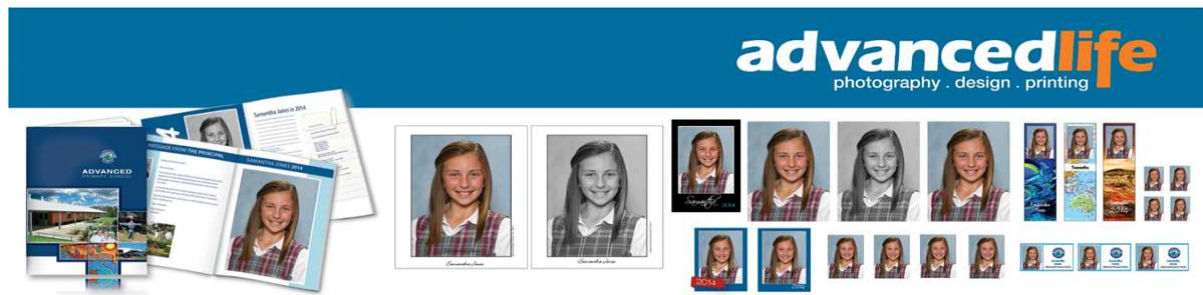

The preference of our school is that Orders and Payments be made through the Web Portal as this reduces the administration and associated order issues related to the return of cash & envelopes on photo day.

UNIVERSITY OF QUEENSLAND STUDY Do you have a child with a chronic illness? How are their brothers and sisters going? Researchers from the University of Queensland are seeking parents with at least one child with any chronic illness (for example; Asthma, Diabetes, Eczema, Epilepsy, and Cystic Fibrosis) and at least one well child (without any chronic illnesses, aged 6 – 12 years). The researcher will be conducting home visits and performing interviews with one parent and one sibling of the child who has the chronic illness. Total duration will be less than 60 minutes. Topics of discussion will be based around the impact of the chronic illness on the well children within the family home. The findings of this study will help inform future parenting interventions for children and siblings living within a home with chronic illness. Did you know that one in three Australians will need donated blood in their lifetime? That figure, and a few significant others, persuaded us to become Red Cross Blood Service Ambassadors and organise a blood drive for our school. In preparation, we attended an information day where the Red Cross told us about blood donation and the process of running a visit of the mobile donation centre to the school. We were shown through the processing centre, which was quite an experience, and we left eager to put all the suggestions into practice. We organised a mobile van to come to the school on Monday 20 July so that students and teachers could come and give blood. On the day we also had a breakfast/snack table to keep people hydrated and well fed.
